Eoin & Dylan Fitzpatrick R.I.P.

July 17th was a dark day for our club.

One of our own Eoin Fitzpatrick, and his cherished son Dylan, tragically passed away in an accident while holidaying in Turkey.

Memories of Eoin playing for Portlaoise are vivid. He was a hurler first and foremost. But he played plenty of football too – especially in his juvenile days. Soccer was also a big love of Eoin's. He was a scoring forward. More than anything he had what looked to be a very natural skill. Except like many who seem to have a natural skill, it was natural because of the amount of times he practiced it. He was left handed and stood out for his skill and style. He had great balance, terrific first touch, that little jink, and a predator's eye when it came to putting that ball into the back of the net or over the bar.

On his recent visit home, club legend Cahir Healy was calling in to see the Fitzpatrick family. He was unsure of the house as it was many years since he was there when Eoin and Cahir were two kids with a shared dream. How he knew he was in the right place is very poignant – the dents in the garage door from the ball being relentlessly pucked against it. The dents are still there and Cahir remembered them from bygone days.

Cahir adds: *'My abiding memory of playing with Eoin with the club and school was his skill. Beautiful first touch. A Typical left handed corner forward! That skill he had wasn't by accident. I remember being out in his house one day and he had the ball out pucking against the garage door. I looked on in horror as he had the garage door with more dents in it than that car in father Ted! He just laughed at me as each puck put a new dent in it. Eoin was a great friend and great fun to be with. Brilliantly quick witted too!'*

Eoin was a proud town man and this was instilled in him from an early age. His dad Frank has been a great advocate of the club and a stalwart in his constant support. His mam Rita is an integral part of 'Mná na gClub' – that great band of women who fed and watered so many of our players and our teams over the years after matches and trainings. Women such as Antoinette Prendergast, Catherine Fitzgerald, Maureen O Keeffe, Marie Daly, Imelda Fitzpatrick, Claire Rigney, Ann Mulhall, Ann Scanlon, and others too. Rita was in the middle of this crew and the stories and yarns are still being told and are the stuff of legend.

And just like Frank and Rita did with Eoin, Eoin too passed on the heritage of Portlaoise GAA. His eldest son Cian is a star player with our U15s. A really talented young player and one to watch out for into the future. We can only imagine how hard it has been for Cian – we hope that our club can be a place where you know you have really strong support into the future.

Our sincere sympathies go to the immediate Fitzpatrick family – Frank, Rita, Maryse, Ciara and Aideen. And to Mark and Travis as brothers and uncles in laws of Eoin and Dylan. To nieces and nephews and cousins Abi, Kandeece, Charlie, Lily and Artie. To Dylan's mam Claire on her unimaginable loss, to Claire's parents and Dylan's grandparents Liz and Andy, Dylan's favourite uncle, Andrew – another club stalwart. And never to forget Eoin's partner Suzie and her two children Jake and Leon who were on holidays, along with Cian, with Eoin and Dylan at the time of the tragedy.

Portlaoise were lucky to have called upon the services of Eoin in a number of finals down through the year. Not all finals were won but Eoin gave his heart and soul for the cause in each and every one of these games as he did anytime he pulled on the club jersey.

Replaced instead, with the gathering of that victorious 2003 Minor-A football panel for their 20 year reunion in Peigs bar, on Friday, August 11th.

An oceans worth of water had passed under the bridge since that momentous day in Stradbally, when an utterly dominant Portlaoise team had overcome the challenge of their opponents with relative ease, as they had done in all of their matches leading up to the final. And so, a second Minor-A football title in a row was secured by the Town. No easy feat.

The Minor B footballers had also done very well that year, overcoming some impressive teams such as Portarlingotn and St. Josephs, to reach their own county decider. It wasn't to be on the day for them though, as they were beaten by Courtwood in the final in Timahoe. Many of that panel would go on to play for the A-team later that year, and were an important part of the victorious Minor-A panel.

In the 20 years that followed, life, as it tends to do, played out in many mysterious ways. Different paths were taken, families and careers were nurtured and grown. And sadly too, some journeys concluded well before their time. History weighed heavily, with many stories and memories to be shared. Yet, as the panel slowly began to gather in Peigs, we were all cast back to our youth. A warm embrace or a hand shake broke the ice, and we were once again the minor football panel of 2003.

The laughs and the pints were in full-flow, as was the banter, with no quarter sought or given. An impromptu 'reeling in the years' overtook many conversations, with memories of old and stories of how life had played out over the past 20

years being shared. Both county finals, particularly the minor B final, were dissected and analysed, and all was well. As well as the panel and management, we were joined by some stalwarts and great servants of the club, including club Chairperson Teddy Fennelly, Eddie McCormack, Paddy O'Shea, Seamus and Catherine Fitzgerald, Liam Dunne and George Plunkett, proprietor of Peigs, who put us up for the night and was a gentleman as always in how he catered for us and looked after us all.

Once the goujons and cocktail sausages had been worked through, we retired to Aunty Nora's, where a few words and presentations were to be shared. Led by 2 town legends, the indomitable Cahir Healy and Danny O'Shea, our Captain in 2003, some beautiful words were spoken, followed by a presentation to all of the management team who looked after us that year. Managers Pat Ryan and Jim McManus, who unfortunately couldn't attend on the night, and selectors Noel Tynan and Kieran Dunphy. A small token presented to each man to say thanks for the many hours of their time and guidance that they gave us.

Special mention was also given in remembrance of those who have sadly gone before us; most notably, Peter 'Chief' McNulty and Eoin Fitzpatrick. To see their Dad's Malachy and Frank there on the night was fantastic. Two young men, taken far before their time; their memory and names will forever remain embroidered within the rich tapestry of Portlaoise GAA Club. And so, after a few group photos, we continued celebrating and reminiscing into the small hours of the morning, before eventually parting ways once more.

Nights like this are priceless in so many ways. They should be treasured and celebrated. Too often in life we focus on only today and tomorrow, forgetting to nurture memories

from the past. The GAA is often called a family, and celebrations such as this do justice to that statement. Here's hoping we're all here to share many more memories and good times in the years ahead.

A special word of thanks to the following people in particular: Cahir Healy for organising the reunion, George Plunkett for providing the venue and food, John Murphy for the fantastic document he put together, charting the rise of this team from under-12 to Minor, Richie Coss for designing the certs that were presented to the management team, Paul Monahan for the frames for the certificates, and Teddy Fennelly Jnr for attending and speaking on behalf of the club on the night.

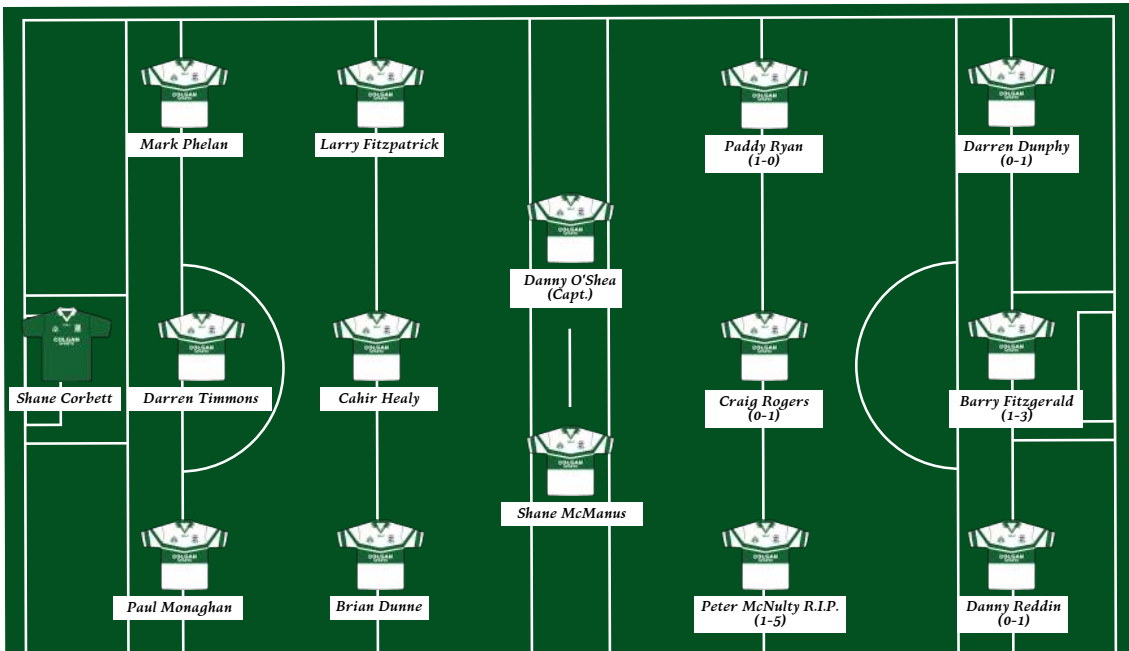

Rathleague Update

Our new floodlight poles are up on Pitch 4 – lights will be added to them in coming weeks.

Ball catching net poles are almost ready to go on Pitch 5.

We will launch the official opening of our walking track, which is also lined with solar light poles, at our upcoming **Walk for the Town** on September 22nd/23rd (more details in this edition). This will be an excellent amenity for the club.

As you have probably heard our weekly online Bingo has finally come to an end. In next months edition we will shine the spotlight on the people who were involved in this and the stats behind one of the best fundraisers our club has ever undertaken. Massive thanks and credit to the people involved in that – it has given our club a chance from a development perspective.

Our fundraising team, together with our development team, are continuing to focus on what needs to be achieved and are already working on the next ideas to move us closer to our targets. We will provide members update in due course.





The Portlaoise GAA Town All Stars are an inclusive GAA team set up in 2021 by a group of determined parents and club committee members, with the intention of giving children with additional needs the opportunity to be a part of a team and to learn to play sport in a safe and adapted environment.

Sal o Dwyer, Aine O'Sullivan and Kimberley Keogh being the first 3 parents on board having first hand experience of what it means to have opportunities like this available to families were determined to get it up and running. With the support and backing from the club and a few other volunteers "The Town All Stars" were created and in September 2021 we had our first training session.

Our original plan was to start out with 15 kids and 10 coaches but with a big demand for spaces and a growing waiting list we decided to add a second session every week and split the group in 2 and soon we had 2 groups of 15 kids and as coaches we were thrilled to be able to give this chance to so many kids and their families. Over time we formed many friendships and bonds amongst coaches, kids and parents and we could see we had something really special happening.

Our sessions consist of teaching the kids drills and skills around GAA such as kicking and throwing the ball, hand passing and many games. We also work on balance and co ordination using all kinds of equipment like hoops, ladders, stepping mats, balance beams etc. we help with hand eye co ordination and help the kids to communicate with both

us coaches and other kids around them too.

We use stations in our sessions in which we put all these things into practice and overtime the kids become familiar with them and their understanding of how to do each task has improved immensely. We start off each session with a 10min warm up and then move on to 3 stations at 5 min each. We then have a quick clear up in which we get the kids to help out and we finish off with 10 mins of parachute at the end, this the kids really love as they all get involved together and they love the counting down and the excitement as the parachute is flung in the air and all the balls go flying they scream with delight and go running to gather them all up and go again. This is a fabulous way to end our sessions each week and everyone goes home happy.

Town All Stars has given so many families and their children a chance to be part of GAA in ways they didn't think would be possible and the aim would be for this to be the case for many years to come. Some of the kids that started out with us have even gone on to play in a more competitive side of GAA and to know that their time with the all stars was a massive contribution towards that is a great feeling for us and part of the reason why we do what we do. Please god many more will follow in these footsteps over the years too.

On the 22nd of August 2022 a massive opportunity came our way and our all stars team got the chance to play in Croke Park, a place all kids dream of playing in and here we were living the dream. They held a massive inclusion open day and many teams from all over Ireland took to the pitch and had a chance to show off all the hard work we had put in since we started. We played football, hurling, and many games and parachutes. We got to eat our lunch in the stands and take pictures pitch side. We met some lovely people and it was truly a fantastic experience for us all. Please god it wont be the last time we see Croker either.

Over the past 3 years the All Stars have gone from strength

to strength and with a current count of 28 kids we are improving every year. Last year we were really blessed with receiving a jersey for each child through the very kind sponsorship of Mark O Dwyer @cleanfreaks car valeting and then again this year with the sponsorship of socks and shorts to match the jerseys, all the kids were made up and thrilled with their full portlaoise gear, we really look the part now. A massive shout out to Mark for these kind gestures we are very grateful to him. We were also very lucky this year to have been sponsored a signed football for each of the kids and a fun day out in the coming weeks from Glanbia. We are so blessed and thankful to them also for their kind gesture also.

The Town All Stars would not be possible without the fantastic team of coaches I have working with me every year. They give their time voluntarily every week and they wouldn't have it any other way. We have built some strong friendships along the way and we work fantastic together too. These coaches are Elaine, Charlie, Breda, Christy, Denise, Clare, Tommy and myself Sal and I want to thank them all now for their continued support, kindness and guidance over the years its always a pleasure to work with you all. I would also like to take this time to thank all within Portlaoise GAA for their continued support of both us coaches and the all stars over the years. There has never been anything to big an ask and we are really blessed to be a part of such a fantastic and supportive club.

To be a part of something as wonderful as the all stars on a weekly basis has been and absolute pleasure and privilege. I have learned so much over the years and so much from each of the kids too. 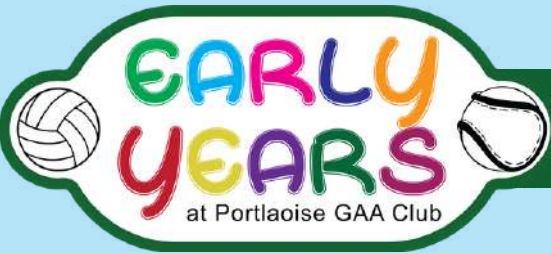

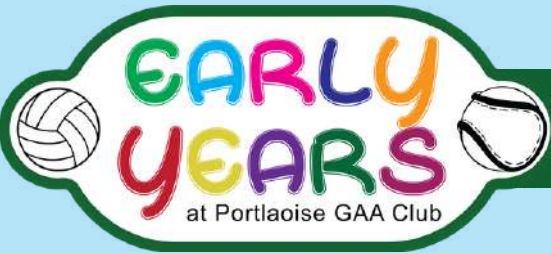
