

Remembering 1984 The "Double Double"

Football

Forty years ago, in 1984, Portlaoise GAA achieved one of the most remarkable feats in Laois sporting history—the legendary "Double Double". Winning the "Double Double" is a feat so rare that it stands as one of the crown jewels in Portlaoise GAA's illustrious history. Achieving senior and minor championship titles in both hurling and football within the same year was a testament to the club's strength at every level.

While the senior teams made history on one front, the future stars of Portlaoise GAA were making waves of their own. The Minor Football and Minor Hurling teams, filled with raw talent and youthful energy, mirrored the achievements of their senior counterparts. Both minor teams played with incredible heart and skill, capturing the Laois Minor Football and Hurling Championship titles. Their success was a promise of the bright future that lay ahead for the club, with many of these young players going on to become key figures in Portlaoise GAA's continued success in the years and decades that followed.

It took replays in the senior hurling, senior football and minor football to complete the "Double Double".

In the minor hurling final Portlaoise were always in control against Borris-in-Ossory, and claimed their first title since 1980 by 2-10 to 1-5. Paul Bergin was the star of the show with a sensational performance – he accounted for all but two of the Town scores.

The minor football saw Graiguecullen trying to win their first minor title since 1949 while Portlaoise were hoping to bridge a much shorter three year gap. In the end it took a last minute goal from Paul Bergin to save the day for Portlaoise – one week after his brother Liam had saved the senior hurlers bacon against the Harps.

Graiguecullen had the game won until Pat Dalton gained possession and he passed to Paul Bergin who finished to the net to secure a reprieve for Portlaoise and left the final score at 3-6 apiece.

In the replay Portlaoise upped their game and with James Fahy leading the scoring with 5 points, a goal from Paul Bergin and a succession of unanswered points from Liam Duggan, Ronan O'Connell, and Tom Fitzpatrick ensured the Corcoran Cup would rest in the county town for 1984.

Final Score 1-8 to 1-2.

Portlaoise faced up to new Laois club, The Harps in the senior hurling final and in the drawn game were lucky to come away with a draw. After the fright of the drawn game, Portlaoise were happy to have a second bite at the cherry and this time they were in much more clinical form. They raced out of the blocks and had seven points on the board before the Harps could muster a response. With players like Mathew Keegan (1-2), Billy Bohane (0-5) and Mickey Bohane (1-1) on scoring form Portlaoise ran out comfortable winners with a scoreline of 2-14 to 1-7.

This was Portlaoise hurlers sixth title in total and fourth on the trot. Amazingly the four finals were won at four different venues and John Joe Ging was captain on all four occasions.


The senior football final was remarkably similar to its hurling counterpart the previous Sunday and also ended in a draw. There was great expectation in the lead-up to the final and Portlaoise were understandable favourites as a result of their recent All-Ireland success. They were chasing a record 15th Laois football title but Ballyroan had a number of stars in their ranks too like Liam Irwin, Mick Drennan, Pat Dunne, Pat McWey, Jim Whelan and county goalkeeper Martin Conroy. The game never lived up to expectations, though, and it was only in the closing stages as Portlaoise fought to retrieve a bleak situation that there was some excitement for the large attendance at the game. The game ended in a stalemate and Portlaoise were again lucky to fight another day. Final score: Portlaoise 0-9 v 1-6 Ballyroan.

Much like the hurling replay Portlaoise grabbed their second opportunity with both hands and won for the club a record breaking 15th football county title. They completely dominated the game and the fact that Ballyroan had to wait until the second minute of the second half to score tells its own story. In the end the game was even more comfortable




than the 2-8 to 0-4 scoreline suggests. The legacy of the "Double Double" still resonates through Portlaoise GAA today. The achievements of that unforgettable year set a standard of excellence that has inspired generations of players to strive for greatness. As we reflect on that historic season, we honour the men who wore the Portlaoise jersey with pride and made history in both





Laois Junior Camogie Champions

Portlaoise stormed to Laois Junior Camogie Championship glory this month with a dominant display over St Lazerian's at Laois Hire O'Moore Park winning 1-10 to 1-3.

Star of the show was Susie Delaney, who delivered a masterclass up front, racking up nine points in a stunning attacking performance that kept the scoreboard ticking over. She was deservedly awarded the Player of the Match honour. The Town's defence was rock solid as well, giving St Lazerian's little to work with, and at the heart of that effort was Ciara Crowley, who was simply immense at centre-back.

It was St Lazerian's who struck first, with Niamh O'Shea opening the scoring after just three minutes to give them a brief lead. But it didn't last long—Susie Delaney levelled matters moments later, slotting over from the right-hand side. She followed up with another fine point to edge Portlaoise ahead, and nearly found the net herself after 12 minutes, only for a brilliant save by Abbeyleix keeper to deny her. She coolly converted the resulting 45, and it was Portlaoise in control.

Their advantage grew when Grainne O'Reilly launched a high ball towards Savannah Lawless, who expertly guided it into the net for the game's first goal after 17 minutes. It was a hammer blow to St Lazerien's, who had been hanging in there until that point. Susie added another free, stretching the lead to six, but St Lazerian's roared back when they scored a goal to breathe life into their challenge.

However, Portlaoise responded with real composure, finishing the half strongly. Amy Byrne chipped in with a tidy point, and another Susie Delaney free left the half-time score at 1-6 to 1-1 in favour of Portlaoise.

St Lazerian's came out for the second half with the wind at their backs and quickly cut the deficit with two quick points. But that would be as close as they'd get.

With their shooting letting them down, St Lazerian's couldn't find the target, and Delaney

punished them once again, popping over a vital score after a fierce scramble for possession inside the 45. She wasn't done yet, adding two more points from frees, and when she split the posts from the left wing with a superb strike—despite being harried by several defenders—the result was all but sealed.

St Lazerian's chased a goal late on, but Portlaoise's defence held firm, with Crowley once again leading the charge at the back, ensuring there would be no late drama.

In the end, it was Portlaoise's day, and they lifted the trophy with pride after a hard-fought campaign.

Delaney, Crowley, and the entire team can be proud of a performance worthy of champions.

Our minors won the Corcoran Cup for the club for a record 26th time this month after a stunning second-half display saw them power past Portarlington on a scoreline of 4-7 to 0-11 at Laois Hire O'Moore Park.

The atmosphere drummed up by our supporters was electric throughout. Three quick-fire goals in the space of nine minutes after the break paved the way for a memorable victory. The sides had gone into the second half level, but Portlaoise's ruthless finishing would ultimately make the difference.

This was our first Minor county title since 2012. It was Portarlington, however, started the brighter of the two, notching the first two scores of the contest. Portlaoise got off the mark through a Darren Brennan free from just inside the Portarlington 45, but Port were quick to respond, adding another point from play

As Portlaoise began to grow into the game, the breakthrough came. A blistering run down the sideline from Aaron McCormack led to a dangerous ball into the Portarlington square. His attempted pass bounced into the path of Liam Conroy, who calmly slotted into an empty net. Brennan then added his second free of the half to edge Brian Dunne's side in front.

Portarlington continued to fight back scoring a free to bring them within touching distance. But Portlaoise hit back with two points without reply—Josh Finn sending over from distance before Conor O'Callaghan popped his first over.

Portarlington finished the half strongly, scoring two quick points in succession. At half-time, Portlaoise held a slender one-point lead, 1-4 to 0-6.

O'Callaghan kicked the opening score of the second half, but Portarlington quickly drew level with two points in quick succession.

Then came Portlaoise's decisive purple patch. Darren Brennan took centre stage, finding the

net twice with clinical finishes that left Portarlington's keeper with no chance. McCormack added a point before Finn Dawson blasted the ball into the top corner, extending the lead to a commanding 10 points. Brennan continued his superb form, adding another score from a 45' to take his personal tally to 2-3.

Portarlington added a couple of points but it was too little too late and in the end, Portlaoise were deserving winners with a performance that will be remembered for years to come.



October 13th, 2024. A chance to add a new chapter to Portlaoise GAA clubs already rich history. For the first time since 1981, our Minor and Senior footballers would play in their own respective county finals on the same day, and at the same venue. 43 years in the making, it was a magnificent achievement for the club, no matter the potential outcome in either game.

For the minor footballers, reaching this year's county decider ended a 12-year wait for possible minor football glory. Considering the rich success of our underage teams down through the years, 12 years seemed like a lifetime. Then again, it also went to show that minor football championships are hard won, and each victory should be treasured. After a tough season, that saw its fair share of highs and lows for the minor footballers, spirits were high in the build-up to the final. There was a togetherness about the group that one doesn't often see. This had been born from many factors. As a team, they had reached incredible heights, winning county titles at under-13 and under-15 level, as well as an under-15 Feiletitle. Unfortunately, they had also experienced harrowing lows. The loss of their friend and teammate David Brown had left an indelible mark on the group. How they responded to his tragic loss really showed just what they were made of. Overcoming early set-backs in the championship, they went on a five game winning streak, before securing their place in the final through a hard-fought victory over Killeshin/Crettyard/Spink.

Character is an often treasured resource; but these young men had shown they had bundles of it. In their first training session after the semi-final win, Coach Paul Cahillane set out what the next 2 weeks would entail from a preparation point of view. No stone would be left unturned; and as he told the boys himself, "If you trust yourselves and do what we're asking of you, you will be county champions". Training itself progressed well, and having had a front-row view of the lads' preparation, I could see myself that they were locked in. They were ready for battle. The day of the county final was treated like any other game, with the players meeting roughly an hour before throw-in. Warm-up schedules were maintained as always, as was the approach from mentors Brian Dunne, Charlie Fitzpatrick, Paul Cahillane, Kevin Gorman and John Delaney. The routine was to be maintained as always. Preparation had been meticulous. It was now up to the players themselves to get the job done.

O'Moore Park was a hive of excitement prior to throw-in. Fans from both Portlaoise and Portarlington made their way to their seats early, such was the excitement and anticipation around seeing both minor and senior footballers from both clubs playing in both games. In the dressing room beforehand, Paul and Brian spoke calmly and concisely to the players. They re-iterated a few keys points around tactics and the general game-plan. Most importantly though, they urged the lads to trust in their own ability. "If you trust in yourselves and in what you're being asked to do, you will be county champions". As they left the dressing room, there was a very definite sense that these boys were ready to reach the promised-land.

Team photos and warm-ups completed, it was time for battle. The early innings of the game were very much even, with both teams playing well within themselves. An early 2 point lead for Port was quickly pulled back by Portlaoise. The first major incident of the game was the first goal. After a brilliant run from Aaron 'Bruno' McCormack, the ball made its way across the face of the goal, where Liam Conroy was there to dispatch it to the net.

Goal secured, the game returned to an even keel, with Port answering back with scores of their own. A 4-point lead late in the first half for Portlaoise was quickly brought back to a point by Port; and that was to be all that separated the sides at the interval. Portlaoise, as had been their custom, had certainly played within themselves in the first half, and this was a point that was touched upon straight away once the team were back within the confines of the dressing room.

There was no need for panic though, as both Brian and Paul evoked calm within the group, once again reminding the lads that "if you trust in yourselves and what you're being asked to do, you WILL be county champions". Nods of approval spoke volumes, and as we made our way back out to the field, positivity and belief flew on our shoulders.

In the second half, Portlaoise were a different beast. The shackles were thrown off, and Portlaoise football took over. 3 goals in 9 minutes, 2 from the indomitable Darren Brennan, along with an exquisite finish from Finn Dawson broke the spirits of the Port team.

Portlaoise now began to win all the 'dirty' ball, as bodies were put on the line. Ben O'Connor, as he had done all year, led by example, putting in a man-of-the-match display that was no more than deserved. Port cried out for mercy, but he had long-since abandoned them. Goals win games, and a final score-line of 4-07 to 0-11 paid homage to that. Portlaoise were once again county Minor 'A' football champions. The scenes of joy and celebration at the end of the game will live long in the memory.

Years of hard work and graft finally coming to fruition. As Ben O'Connor made his winning captains speech, he spoke with an elegance and composure that was far beyond his years. He finished by remembering David Brown, dedicating the win to his memory, and emphasising that the players had won this title for him. There's not a doubt in my mind that he was there on the field of battle with them. '*David Brown, Forever Young*' rested proudly on the sleeves of the lads jerseys.

Portlaoise, Minor 'A' football Champions 2024 now rests proudly on the Corcoran Cup.
